Lachish Expedition 2014

Concordia Lutheran Seminary extends an open invitation to all LCC pastors, deacons, and church-members to take part in its 2014 expedition to Israel under the direction of Dr. Steve Chambers. This year's group will be based at Lachish, about 40 km SW of Jerusalem, instead of its usual base at Hippos, where previous CLS teams helped excavate a Byzantine church-complex. This spectacular Old Testament-era dig at Lachish (10th/9th c BC) is under the overall direction of Dr. Josef Garfinkel of Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

The group leaves Canada on Tuesday, July 9 and returns on Tuesday, July 29. Two weeks (10 days) of digging at Lachish will be interspersed with touring in and around Jerusalem (4 days), the Negev desert (2 days), and Galilee (4 days). The projected cost per person is approximately \$4,300 CAD. This includes airfare (Edmonton-Tel Aviv and return), local transportation, all accommodations, most meals, and most admission fees. Participants from other parts of Canada may make arrangements to meet the Edmonton group at Pearson airport in Toronto.

Since 2002, Dr. Steve Chambers has taught at Concordia Lutheran Seminary in Edmonton. He is currently Academic Dean and Professor of Exegetical Theology. This is the fifth time since 2006 that he will be leading a group of archaeological volunteers to Israel.

“A Man for our Times: Bach’s Music and Theology for a New Millennium”

Presenter: Rev. Lorne Manweiler is pastor of Redeemer Lutheran Church, Edmonton, AB, instructor of organ and resident organist at Concordia University College of Alberta, Edmonton, and accompanist for the Concordia Community Chorus.

So often, J.S. Bach is held up as a paragon of the high Baroque and of an even higher church music. It may be surprising to many that Bach dealt with the same grass-roots challenges the modern church worker and church musician faces: chronic lack of resources, doctrinal inconsistency, cultural pressure, few capable parish musicians, and often antagonistic working relationships. These four sessions will examine Bach’s philosophy and theology of church music practice historically, musically, practically, and theologically, and translate those principles into the new millennium. The course caters to the non-musician and musician, theologian and layperson alike.

Distance Education

Since 2011, the Edmonton and St. Catharines seminaries have been sharing courses over the internet. This fall Professor Kraemer taught “The Introduction to the Study of Scripture” and Dr. Kettner taught “Christianity and World Religions” to students on both campuses via distance education.

CLS continues to offer a variety of opportunities for students to participate from a distance. In the Fall semester, students in the Open Studies program joined Dr. Kettner via videoconference in the weekly evening seminar, “Theological Method,” to earn credit toward the Graduate Certificate in Theological Studies. One student enrolled from as far away as Mississippi!

Once again, beginning in the third week of January, Dr. Kettner will offer the evening seminar “God, Creation, and Anthropology” for residential and remote students. The class will meet online every Thursday from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm (MDT) using videoconference.

Four Entrance Scholarships to be Awarded Again in 2014!

It has been a great joy for him to have the wonderful experiences that seminary has allowed, such as the take wing project that took him to Winkler/Morden Manitoba, and his field education experiences at both Riverbend Lutheran and All Saints Lutheran Church in Edmonton. Eric has certainly found that the seminary experience is one that will stretch you and help you to grow both spiritually and as an individual. Eric and Kayla are both very excited for the future and have great anticipation for the many opportunities the God will set before them.

Adopt-A-Student

The Adopt-A-Student program has been a great blessing for the students again this year. Already in November there are a total of 43 sponsors. By comparison, the total number of sponsors by the end of last school year was 46.

Who are those sponsors? Most of them come from Alberta and British Columbia (33) with the remaining 10 coming from Saskatchewan and Manitoba. LWML-Canada groups and Ladies' Aid groups make up the majority of the sponsors (28). Congregations also make up a large number of the sponsors (13). Individuals and couples have also taken up the challenge (2).

Why do they do it? One of the congregations, St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Calgary celebrated their 100th anniversary this year. While celebrating

the past, they decided to ensure ministry continues on into the future by adopting four students. Other groups have been adopting students for years, making it their regular goal to get their adopted students through the seminary years. Whatever the reason, the Adopt-A-Student program is a personal way of letting the students know they are cared for. Their brothers and sisters in Christ honour the sacrifices they are making in order to be prepared to serve God and the Church.

Our deepest gratitude to Dr. Threinen for his two years of service as Interim President. We thank God for the gifts Norman brought to our Seminary in this time of transition. God truly blessed us with a wonderful leader and a dear friend. God's blessings to you both as you return home and continue to serve our Lord and Saviour in your lives in Summerland.

You may have heard that I have announced my retirement from the seminary at the end of this academic year, which will mark twenty-seven years of teaching here. Since I joined the faculty at the beginning of the fourth academic year, and we are now in the thirtieth, I have had the privilege of teaching almost every graduate of the seminary, missing just a few at the beginning.

When I arrived, Lutheran Church–Canada was still a federation of districts of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod. Founding seminary president Dr. Ted Janzow had worked to provide a solid theological and academic foundation on which to build, bringing Dr. Ronald Vahl and Dr. Norman Threinen onto the original faculty, and then adding me as the third professor just before he retired. Under Dr. Milton Rudnick's leadership the seminary moved from the original house, and, after a year at Grace Lutheran Church, into its current facility. Under Dr. L. Dean Hempelmann, and with the leadership of academic dean Dr. Vahl, the seminary moved to full accreditation with the Association of Theological Schools. After Dr. Vahl's untimely death in 1999, I moved into the position of academic dean, where I served until 2011. I served during the presidencies of Drs. Bacon and Zeuch, and have had the opportunity myself to serve as interim president. Over the years numerous faculty and staff changes have taken place. Also over the years Mindy has supported me and the seminary, as a volunteer at the front desk, and designing and making the annual theme banners for many years. While the seminary has had its challenges at times, by God's grace it continues to thrive.


