

This position provides vital professional support for faculty and sharing of both academic and administrative duties at the Seminary. The position will augment present full time faculty in such areas as church history, missions and evangelism, stewardship, Christian care and counseling, and Christian spirituality. The faculty member who will be invited to hold this professorial chair will be a scholar in his field and, like all our professors, provide our students with the highest quality teaching. The chair gives additional resources to provide academic lectures and seminars to the greater community and gives every faculty member more time to spend in extended research.

The addition of a faculty member will bring aboard another scholar who can make his own scholarly contributions, and this will also enable the existing faculty to devote more time to research and writing for the wider church and the wider scholarly community. Each professor currently carries at least two administrative portfolios in addition

to his teaching load. With the addition of a new professor, administrative loads will be lightened for each professor and programs like distance education will receive renewed attention and management.

Endowed professorial chairs are supported by perpetually endowed funds. The principal of a major gift in support of a chair is invested and derived income is used to further the academic program of Concordia Lutheran Seminary. Income from the fund supports a professor's compensation.

An endowed chair has been established by the Board of Regents of Concordia Lutheran Seminary. The endowment is to be developed through gifts in cash, binding pledges, and irrevocable trusts that will create the required fund to generate income interest that covers the cost of the chair. The Board hopes that 100 percent of the chair's funding level will be reached quickly. It will require an endowment principal of about \$1,300,000 to fund a chair.

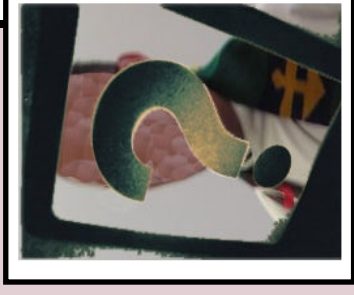
