Guild Representatives

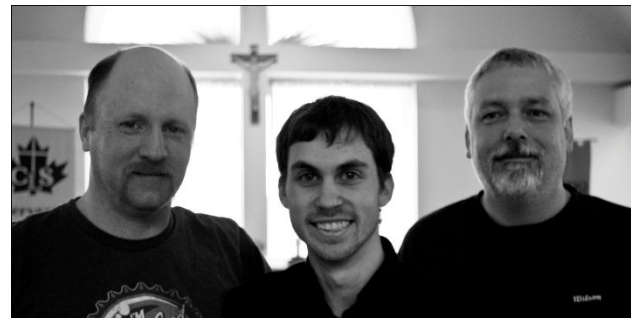

While seminarians and their life at the Sem. are the foci of Guild activities, the work of Guild members and represented goes on all over the country.

That's especially true of those people who have volunteered to be Guild representatives. You know the ones. They may already have approached you this year for membership money and then they ask you for your address, your phone number, and even your email address! CLS Guild representatives have been faithfully and persistently "niggling" people for years because they recognize the value and the struggles of seminary education. They know that the students have given up lifestyles and means of support in order to immerse themselves in four years of intensive post-graduate study and personal formation. The representatives feel the needs that the students and their families face; they want to support, and get others to help support, the students in the midst of seminary life.

Take Wing across western Canada

For another year, three second-year seminarians* spread out from Edmonton to bring a little bit of seminary life to communities away from the campus of Concordia Lutheran Seminary. Todd Guggenmos was hosted by Walnut Grove Lutheran Church in Maple Ridge, BC, Vincent Moore by Redeemer Lutheran Church in Victoria, BC, and Mark Schultz by Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Regina.

No student trip to the parish is usual and this year's trips were no exception. Todd joined his host at his arrival by attending a funeral. They followed that up with home and church visits, a men's breakfast, a visit to an addiction recovery facility, meetings with friends and church members, preaching and service assistance before returning home. Mark's trip to Regina was just as packed full of visits and meetings. His introduction to the church was through the Friday evening youth group. He, too, continued with Saturday visits and meetings before helping with Sunday service and sermon. As with the others, Vince assisted in

Sunday morning preaching and worship. In addition to similar experiences, he enjoyed the added benefit of meeting with the local “winkel,” the name given to circuit meetings of pastors who take time each month to share in collegiality, personal concerns, and events in their parishes.

Each seminarian returned to the seminary enthusiastically talking about parish life with an almost wistful anticipation for their next year in vicarage and a future when they can be immersed in parish life. Each one revealed the great opportunity they had to represent the seminary in the midst of their time as students and to speak about their jobs as seminarians. Whether during their visits with their billets, ministering at homes and institutions in the parishes or ministering in front of the assembled worshippers, they experienced first-hand what would become their roles as pastors and shared what are currently their lives in the seminary.

The Take Wing program connects currently working second-year seminarians with churches. Both the students and the church communities hear and tell each other about their respective worlds and give each other a glimpse into life in the parish and at the Sem. This year many more churches requested students than there were students available. If your congregation would like a Take Wing visitor next winter, send a note to the Development Department making your interest known. Seminarians will be assigned in late November or early December.
